PUBLIC HEARING (Items 6 – 7)

6. CONDUCT THE PUBLIC HEARING AND INTRODUCE FOR FIRST READING, BY TITLE ONLY, AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND TITLE 15 OF THE ATHERTON MUNICIPAL CODE ADOPTING BY REFERENCE THE 2022 CALIFORNIA BUILDING STANDARDS CODE, RETAINING EXISTING MODIFICATIONS; AND RATIFY THE FIRE REGULATIONS, AS ADOPTED BY THE MENLO PARK FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT.

Building Official Greenlee introduced the item and the Council conducted the public hearing. Fire Marshal Johnson also presented the Menlo Park Fire Protection District.

Council had a few questions for Fire Marshal Johnston, discussed which jurisdictions are are governed by the adoption and discussed the need to include Section 8 and City Attorney Ebrahimi suggested a strike-out to avoid confusion considering other upcoming ordinance amendments related to green building codes.

MOTION by Polito, Second by Lewis to conduct the public hearing and introduce for First Reading, by title only, an Ordinance amending Title 15 of the Atherton Municipal Code adopting by Reference the 2022 California Building Standards Code, retaining existing modifications; and ratify the fire regulations, as adopted by the Menlo Park Fire Protection District, striking out Section 8 in its entirety.
